Attendance

If your child is absent, please telephone the school office before 9.45 am to inform us as to why your child is absent. Please do not inform teachers or teaching assistants of your child’s absence.

If you do not ring the office, a call will be sent out from the office via Truancy Call. You will then be asked to leave a message. Please make sure you leave a clear message. If we do not receive a reason for your child’s absence the absence will be unauthorised.

Frequent absence can add up to a considerable amount of lost learning and can seriously disadvantage your child in adult life. If your child’s level of absence is of serious concern you will receive another letter advising you about improving attendance. After this, any further unauthorised absence may result in the school and the Local Authority taking legal action which could include a fine.

Extended Holidays

In line with Government requirements and Birmingham City Council policies, we are unable to authorise absence unless it falls within the exceptional circumstance criteria. An example of which would be an immediate family member falling ill and the tickets being booked that day, for an immediate departure.

Last year our school suffered from a number of extended holidays in the summer term, pulling our school attendance down to a level that OFSTED deem unacceptable. The children missed vital work to prepare them for the following year and the school will fail to receive the “Outstanding” OFSTED label that we are striving for, due the attendance level– which is out of our control. As we have stated in our newsletter every week, we will be following the Fixed Penalty Notice procedure to the letter without exception.

Prosecution of parents/carers, Education Act 1996 Section 444

At Victoria Law Court in December 2017, the first case against a parent at Canterbury Cross Primary School was heard. After hearing the circumstances of the case the Magistrates imposed a fine of £160, costs of £110 and a victim surcharge of £30; a total of £300.

This was for 1 parent for 1 child

Medical Appointments

If your child has an appointment at the Doctor’s or Hospital, please provide a letter to the school office. If we do not receive a letter or card then the absence will be unauthorised.

E-Safety

The best way to protect yourself from fraud is to be aware, so here are our 5 top tips:

1. Never disclose banking PIN numbers or passwords.
2. Never disclose card reader codes over the phone under any circumstances.
3. Always check that websites are secure and protected when making transactions. Look for https:// & a padlock.
4. Never allow remote access to your computer when someone calls you unexpectedly.
